The treatment plan is for a duration of 3-5 years; during this time it is imperative that the Japanese Knotweed is not cut down, dug up or disturbed in any way as this could cause it to spread, resulting in delays to the treatment plan, additional costs and may render your guarantee invalid.

Important facts about Japanese Knotweed, not to be ignored...

The do's:

- Relax, and leave the Japanese Knotweed well alone!
- Allow us entry onto the site when the scheduled Herbicide treatment is due.
- Notify us immediately if you suspect that there is new growth or re-growth of Japanese Knotweed during your treatment plan or guarantee period.
- Allow 10 minutes after our treatment to use your garden, this allows the weedkiller to dry. Our herbicides are human and pet safe.



- Treat the Japanese Knotweed with your own form of Herbicide.
- Cut down or trim any green or treated Knotweed growth during the Treatment Programme or Guarantee period.
- Disturb the ground within 7 metres of the Japanese Knotweed, as this may trigger a trace of rhizome in the soil to grow.
- Dispose of any Knotweed material as it's classed as controlled waste.
- Refuse us entry for a scheduled Herbicide treatment (please note we will always give you 2-3 days' notice).
- Remove our fencing or warning signs.
- Dispose or relocate any soil that is within 7 meters of the Knotweed growth.
